religious gathering planned for next year. The fact that madame Louise Shao and her son introduced us to the deep resonances of Chinese music was a promising sign of this wider openness to the various religious traditions in our region. The theme of the Breath, which for us Christians refers to the mystery of the spirit, along with the dialogue with the great traditions of Asia remain central points in my theological and spiritual research.

In these moments of confinement which can serve as a kind of retreat, allowing us to regain awareness of the importance of prayer, of a simple meditation which allows us to be born and live unceasingly from the Spirit, from the breath. «Births» from within, in the often unnoticed dynamic of our breath, where we completely abandon ourselves so that we can receive even more breath. This prayer, meditation so



simple can connect us to the very mystery of Jesus, the beloved Son. Incessant mystery of gift between him and the father in the divine breath. We also hope to offer in the course of the coming months, some highlights that can help us to descend within ourselves by the practice and simple teaching of such themes. ACCOMPANIMENT

A little more than two years ago the community had offered me to follow a training in spiritual accompaniment. This formation was set up by the diocese to respond to real need for a number of people.

This training is given by two trainers from the Manresa centre run by the Jesuits and is therefore based on Jesuit spirituality. Between twenty and twenty-five people responded to the offer that was proposed to them. This cycle consists of four sessions of three days, an accompanied individual retreat, various tasks and subjects for reflection in between time, and the invitation to form smaller local groups to meet up between the main sessions. I receive this formation as a good immersion into the Church, by way of this sample, so diverse and so complementary, both in vocations, (laity, deacons, priests, religious), as in the commitments and the missions of each, and by their age. A richness of discovery of the face of the local Church, of intense testimonies, in all simplicity and humility.

This training is for the whole person and is very demanding and searches our profound depths. It touches a thirst in me, one of a true inner pilgrimage. And then very gently we began to put into practice some of the things that we learnt. Rereading and discernment exercises, are precious in many facets of my vocation, and in the services entrusted to me. The service of accompaniment fills me with gratitude for this anchoring in the life of the church, through the concrete companionship of people involved in parishes or other places.

THE DIVINE BREATH



The theme of our inter-religious meeting of 2020 was "Sacred Breath and Music" a gathering which was very much reduced in number this year because of the pandemic. The **breath** directed us towards the East. In three short hours we tasted and appreciated the Surates of the Qur'an, sung and explained by the Imam of Belfort. We heard the Kaddish, a central element of Jewish liturgy, referring to the vision of Ezekiel This chant, whose theme is the glorification and sanctification of the divine name, took us back to the roots of the Lord's Prayer, which was sung in Aramaic by our Iragi friends. The highlight of the meeting was a text by the Chinese sage Zhuang Zhou on that Great Breath which animates Nature and mankind. If the pandemic prevented us from including in our programme the recitation of Sutras by Buddhist friends, with whom we have been in contact throughout this year.
